on: submitting research project funding proposals under the call announced by the International Visegrad Fund - the VISEGRAD GRANTS (Visegrad/Visegrad+/Strategic Grants).

This is to inform you that the International Visegrad Fund has opened call for proposals under the VISEGRAD GRANTS (Visegrad/Visegrad+/Strategic Grants) for projects **in active partnership with, and thematically related to, the region of the Visegrad Group (V4) countries.**

In the case of the **Visegrad Grants and Visegrad Grants +** programmes, the projects must address one of the seven areas:

1. Culture and Common Identity
2. Education and Capacity Building
3. Innovation, R&D, Entrepreneurship
4. Democratic Values and the Media
5. Public Policy and Institutional Partnership
6. Regional Development, Environment and Tourism
7. Social Development

In the case of the **Strategic Grants** programme, the projects must address one of the three areas:

1. Research, development and innovation; digitalisation
2. Disease recovery (Covid Post-COVID Recovery)
3. Challenges and perspectives of the young generation in the Visegrad region

The call for proposals is open until 1 June 2022, 12:00 p.m.

Terms and conditions of applying in the call are available on the websites of:

Terms of application:

- The call is open to all legal subjects (other than state administration and natural persons) from any country, provided that the project features:
 - in the case of the **Visegrad Grants and Visegrad Grants+** programmes, participation of parties from at least three countries (V3) of the Visegrad Group (V4);
 - in the case of the **Strategic Grants** programme, participation of parties from each country of the Visegrad Group (V4);
 - **in the case of a programme carried out as trans-border collaboration**, participation of one (V1) partner based in a V4 country.

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- **JU entities decide on** the subject scope of the proposal, with the reservation that under the Visegrad/Visegrad+/Strategic Grants call **one JU entity may submit only one proposal in the capacity of Leader, provided that the JU entity is not currently carrying out a project financed from the Visegrad Fund.**

The above limitation does not apply to submitting proposals in the capacity of Partner.

- A JU entity submits with the RSC one proposal, indicated by the head of the JU organisational entity (i.e. Dean, Director/Head of other organisational entity), in which it acts in the capacity of **Leader**.

PLEASE NOTE:

At the moment, the Faculty of International and Political Studies, the Faculty of Law and Administration carry out Visegrad Grants projects acting as Leaders, which renders them eligible for application under the call only as Partners.

Terms of funding:

- Support from the Visegrad Fund is intended in the first place for **covering the costs of project participation by participants from the V4 countries.** The funding may cover 100% of the project's budget. Indirect costs may not exceed 15% of the project's overall cost.
- The funding for projects can be received under the three grant programmes:
 - 1) Visegrad Grants – the project should be submitted to a consortium comprising at least three organisations based in the V4 countries.
 - 2) Visegrad+ Grants – the project should be submitted to a consortium comprising at least four organisations, of which at least three must be based in different V4 countries, and at least one in the Western Balkans or the Eastern Partnership.
 - 3) Strategic Grants – the project should be submitted to a consortium comprising at least four organisations based in the V4 countries.

Project duration:

The total project implementation period (Visegrad Grants and Visegrad+ Grants) should be at least 18 months, and in the case of Strategic Grants a project may be implemented over a period between 12 and 36 months.

Form of submitting proposals:

Proposals should be submitted in English, in an electronic form via website of the Visegrad Fund:

Please bear in mind that sending the proposal via website of the Visegrad Fund cannot be reversed and prevents later modifications.

In light of the above, the proposal in an electronic form may be sent in only once the required approvals on the research project entry form and signatures of the University Authorities have been obtained. Information on approval of the proposal by JU authorities will be delivered by a call assistant at the Research Support Centre.

JU internal regulations:

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persons interested in entering the call are asked to deliver to the RSC:

- **by 18 May 2022**
 - **a proposal draft** (electronic version sent as a pdf file to the address of the call assistant at the RSC) for the purposes of review and verification of formal eligibility;
 - **a research project entry form and VAT eligibility form.** The forms should be filled out in the electronic system JU Project Zone available at: <https://strefaprojektow.uj.edu.pl/>;
- **by 26 May 2022 – the final version of the proposal** (electronic version sent in as a pdf file signed with a qualified electronic signature or a hard copy signed with handwritten signatures) – signatures required: project author and the head of the JU organisational entity (i.e. Dean or Director/Head of other organisational entity) acting as the project's host institution.
